The Town Hall was closed to the public in March, after the Governor issued the original Stay Home order. Town Employees were deemed essential and we continued to work from home and from the office as necessary. We were one of the few Town Halls in Franklin County to reopen again. Unfortunately, with the up-tick of positive cases in Massachusetts we want to make sure we are taking every precaution.

Shelburne Falls Initiative: Making Downtown Shine

Holiday and Seasonal Decorations and Lights Progress Report

GSFABA had to figure out a way to keep going without the support of the Towns.

Last fall, the Board authorized Whit to seek a Commonwealth Places Grant from MassDevelopment for a new *Shelburne Falls Initiative* to implement a new year-round decoration project for the village.

The Initiative morphed into two projects after COVID struck – the **Economic Recovery Fund** and **Village Revitalization Project**

GSFABA and the BOF Committee needed a permanent spot to store all our decorations, lights, and the new holiday and year-round decorations that have been purchased by or donated to GSFABA for the Village and BOF.

Ultimately, we chose the Cowell Gym because it gives Nick, Paul and other Village Volunteers a warm space to fluff, fix, and ready the decorations each year and a secure space with an elevator to keep all the decorations for the entire village.

We estimate the in-kind services & equipment contributed for this year via GSFABA to be worth about \$50,000 – every year volunteers ready, install, maintain, and remove the holiday decorations, which is no small task. The volunteers include a Project Manager (coordination & fundraising), Logistics Manager (getting 8-10 volunteers & coordinating the holiday decorations installation and take-down), Designer & Builder (advises, designs lighting & helps purchase quality lighting), and new stars for the BOF values at \$15,000.

Without GSFABA and the volunteers, the towns would be on the hook for decorations.

CONWAY STREET ROAD PROJECT MOVING FORWARD

A multi-million dollar road reconstruction project to address the deteriorating Conway Street, Summer Street, South Street and Conway Road to the Town Line is still in the design phase but on schedule for early 2022. The Town is working with Nitsche Engineering and MassDOT to complete the project which is funded through the federal Transportation Improvement Plan.

In addition to a full depth reconstruction of the roadway the project includes new sidewalks, drainage and water / sewer utility improvements.



Crittenden Hill Road Stormwater Management Concept Design



Crittenden Hill Road Stormwater Mitigation

Buckland Green Streets is a project initiated by the Franklin Regional Council of Governments (FRCOG) with funding from a MassDEP 604b grant to assess the potential for Green Infrastructure (GI) stormwater management in Shelburne Falls on the Buckland side. The goals of the project are to improve water quality in the Deerfield River, to help the village and surrounding watershed become more resilient to increasingly frequent and intense precipitation, and to mitigate the flood hazards resulting from heavy rain events. FRCOG staff worked with the Town Highway and Water Superintendents to develop a stormwater management concept for Crittenden Hill Road where GI can be implemented in conjunction with planned municipal road work currently needed to repair the road and address erosion hazards that threaten residential properties and steep slopes flanking the road. The concept proposes to retrofit and utilize an abandoned water tank and implement a new bioretention basin to capture and clean large volumes of stormwater before it enters the storm sewer and outlets to the Deerfield River. This concept design was be developed to 25% with cost estimates by a Professional Engineer.

DEP-604 (b) Project Highlight

In 2018 the Franklin Regional Council of Governments (FRCOG) was awarded a 604(b) grant to develop a cost-effective replicable assessment protocol for including Green Infrastructure (GI) stormwater Best Management Practices in road improvement and downtown revitalization projects. FRCOG partnered with the Town of Buckland to identify aging infrastructure for improvement with GI in the Village of Shelburne Falls. Nine priority sites were identified for assessment using the GI Assessment Method that FRCOG developed. The project resulted in the *Buckland Green Streets Road Map*, which provides the Town with an assessment method for evaluating GI for transportation and downtown revitalization projects and the development of 25% design plans for the selected site. This assessment methodology can easily be utilized by other municipalities as well.
