- 2. Review and approve minutes from 27 February 2019 meeting.
  - Approved unanimously as written
- 3. Discussion of solarize programs past, present, & future including state/federal incentives for residents, businesses, and municipalities, community solar initiatives
  - Discussion of recent EverSource bills: noticing net metering charge and other charges potentially associated with solar. "Claw-backs"? For next meeting, all will do some research on the broken-down residential charges
- 4. Discussion of local and regional energy-related issues, including:
  - MCAP
  - Rail transport of fossil and other fuels; concerns about derailments, remaining railroad ties and debris along tracks
  - State-proposed energy legislation, including proposed "woodlands partnership"; response to Northern Pass
  - Alternative electric power suppliers; regional municipal electricity aggregation updates
  - MassSave program updates
  - New Massachusetts programs: (through Mass CEC and DOER; Center for EcoTechnology --CET)
  - Municipal lighting/streetlights
  - Recycle-able/biodegradable plastic bags; single-use water bottles
    - OMCAP: Brian attended most recent meeting on 5 March. Discussed possibilities of pipeline companies applying for extensions locally (in Berkshire distribution area); MA HR1419, and impetus for removing "biomass" as a form of renewable energy from Omnibus Energy Bill
    - ° Piles of railroad ties along Route 2 in Charlemont; discussed possibility of getting in touch with Charlemont to potentially collaborate on this issue
    - $^{\circ}$  Municipal Electricity Aggregation: Next meeting of towns on April 11th at FRCOG
    - ° Street lights: noted that Gill: didn't hire EverSource to do the change-over: importance of bidding to potentially cut costs; consider cold weather tolerance of fixtures/bulbs
    - Bags: Discussed possibility of cloth bags replacing plastic at local businesses; Brian independently looking into potential costs/designs if his company were to manufacture bags

- 5. Update on past Green Communities Grant applications; planning for 2019 continue discussion on potential projects to include in future applications, especially those that will bring us closer to the 20% reduction in energy use marker DOER updates?
  - ° Bob has submitted the 2019 grant application: municipal lighting project
  - ° Margaret will contact Jim Barry to get information on how many smaller towns have been able to meet the 20% energy use reduction, opening up possibility of submitting grant proposals for residential use.
