Jim explains that his budget is higher because he wants to bring back part-time officer hours to 2019 level after they were cut in 2020. Jim would like to request that we communicate with him any cuts we make in budgets before it gets to town meeting floor. Heather will ensure that department heads see their budgets as soon as they are done.

Fourth cruiser is used for details. Right now no maintenance costs.

State is requiring that we change the radios we use. FRCOG will give us Kenwood brand radios, which is what the state will finance. Because these are less reliable than the Motorola radios that we currently use, Jlm is requesting \$10,000 to upgrade the radios that we would get from FRCOG. State will finance 9 radios of the lesser cost. Jim would like to stick with the Motorola radios, which will cost about \$500 per radio more plus the mobile radios. Radios cost \$4,000 to \$5,000 a piece.

Oil costs are down, and Jim points to the insulation that was installed. Electric is helped by the LED lighting.

Currently the gate is open May 1 to Sept 15. The committee would like to keep it open in April and close Dec. 1. Lots of rentals in September and October and would like to offer the pavilion for rent until the end of October. They have requested \$30,000-45,000 capital for putting in a new septic in the fall of 2020. There aren't grants for this and it's the next step in the process. Ben asked if it could wait and be done when the digging for the building is done - could save some money and would create a mess there only once.

Rec got the word that their application for a grant??? s looking good and should be approved. Looking at ½ grants, ½ town, ½ donations for funding the \$600,000 needed to finish the pool project (in addition to the \$500,000 donation). Paula asked if that money is invested and if it can be invested. Requesting funding for a new septic system. We would need to put together an RFP and could not begin until the money was available on July 1. New septic system would be separate from the current system.

Rec is purchasing a sign and hoping signage will be branded so that folks know they are in a Buckland park.

School Committee reps Martha Thurber and David Parrella arrive 10 am

Martha explained the plan for the Mohawk School District in the wake of the unfortunate departure of Superintendent Michael Buonaconti: Leann Loomis is in place for now. They have some good candidates for interim superintendent 2-3 days a week and will be looking for a permanent person. Considering the departure of the superintendent, they do not yet have a budget but hope to have one by Feb 10.

Franklin County Tech Rick Martin, superintendent; Russ Kaubris, business manager arrive 10:25 am

Presentation: Added AP classes. Adding veterinary studies and LPN and certified medical assistant programs. Means our students would not go to Smith for this. Enrollment is cycling back up. This year Buckland has 6 but they expect it to be 9-10 next year.

Capital assessment is going down to \$5,968.84 from \$7,400 since it's not a fixed loan and changes annually. They will send the debt schedule to Heather.

Right now operating expense is going up an average of 3%. Tuition for nonmember towns is about \$20,000 plus special ed plus transportation. Our assessment will be lower in FY21 but higher as our enrollment catches up (a year lag time). Laura Earle is the Buckland board rep.

Accessibility upgrades can probably wait for some grant opportunities. They were asked to come up with a repair schedule over the next 5 years to prioritize needs since the entire request can't be funded all at once.

There is a septic tissue at the building that must be attended in the near future.
