Transfer Station Regulations

- 1. Transfer Station stickers will be issued after proof of residency is shown. Transfer Station stickers are available at the Town Hall from the Administrative Assistant (Monday Friday, 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m). Stickers are to be displayed on lower left or rear window of your vehicle.
- 2. An attendant will monitor stickers at the Transfer Station; **NO ONE** will be allowed to enter the Transfer Station without a **CURRENT STICKER**.
- 3. All trash_must be disposed of in a trash bag displaying a Town of Buckland green trash bag sticker. Trash bag stickers are \$2.00 each and are available at Buckland Town Hall (Monday Friday, 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.), Buckland Public Library, LaBelle's Sales and Service, McCusker's Market, and Shelburne Farm and Garden. Town of Buckland 25-gallon bags are sold at Town Hall, ten for \$12.50.
- 4. Recyclable materials may be disposed of free of charge. Shoes are required to be worn.
- 5. No removal of items from Transfer Station property person will be prosecuted.
- 6. No smoking is allowed at the Transfer Station. Children and/or pets must be confined to the vehicle.

Allowable Items:

Clean and dry paper and cardboard; junk mail; boxboard; newspapers/inserts; magazines/catalogs; paper bags; white and colored office paper; computer paper; corrugated cardboard; paperbacks and phone books. All paper and cardboard must be clean and dry. Remove wrappings from junk mail. Glass bottles/jars (only clear, green, brown, less than two gallons); aluminum, tin/steel cans and lids and aluminum foil; milk and juice cartons (tent top); drink boxes; plastic bottles, jars, tubs, and microwave trays/containers, clear drink cups, clear plastic egg cartons. Empty and rinse all containers. All types of metal, ferrous, non-ferrous, clean waste oil, yard waste (no trash or branches).

Do Not Include:

Plastic bags or wraps, motor oil bottles, Styrofoam, egg cartons, syringes/hypodermic needles, broken glass, soda or beer holders/cartons, ceramics, aerosol cans.

SELECT BOARD ANNUAL REPORT 2020

What a year 2020 was. The Covid-19 Pandemic took a firm hold on us early on causing us to change how we have done business in Town Hall for the last 240 years. No longer could we drop by and get caught up on Town happenings. In March we finally locked the doors and made interaction with town offices either remote or by appointment only. Much of our work was done via Zoom or conference calls. In the beginning it all seemed so awkward. But we trudged onward and found that there were some advantages: because we could attend any meeting from the couch in the living room, important meetings were very well attended. We found that working from home could be quite efficient. And holding Town Meeting in the parking lot at Mohawk Trail Middle/High School was as well attended as any town meeting in recent memory. Because of all the work Town Hall staff did in pre-planning and an excellent sound system hired by the Town Administrator, Heather Butler, everyone could hear fine and participate easily. It was quite a sight seeing citizens vote by raising the bright pink and orange cards up through their sun roofs.

Even during the pandemic, life in Buckland continued. We had two significant retirements: Janice Purinton retired after 30 years as our Town Clerk, and Sherry Clark retired after 19 years as Assistant to the Select Board. We wondered if the workings of Town Hall would grind to a halt without these two women. However, transitions are part of life and these went remarkably smoothly thanks to the five years of training Elizabeth Cerone had in the Clerk's office before winning the race for Town Clerk. Pam Guyette, our Assessor, agreed to add two days to her schedule and pick up much of Sherry's responsibilities with Board's Clerk Mary Bolduc picking up much of the rest, importantly the taking of minutes.

Our Tax Collector/Treasurer, Lisa Blackmer along with our bond counsel, negotiated the largest loan in the Town's history: we paid off the remaining amount on the Town Hall renovation loan and added that amount to the \$2.8 million needed to cover the construction loan on the new Highway maintenance facility. Altogether we borrowed \$3.045 million at an effective rate of 1.49% and saved ourselves \$16,000 in interest payments on the renovation loan.

In the Highway Department we had some turnover and ended up with wonderful additions to the crew; now working with Steve Daby are Michael Lovett, Jake Purinton and Anthony Gutierrez. They did an outstanding job of clearing our roads of snow and ice this winter. We also hired outside contractors to help with winter roads and we will be analyzing the pros and cons of outsourcing some of our road work.

And speaking of road work, a big thank you goes to Heather Butler who has successfully mined the State's grant opportunities to improve our roads. This past year the Town was able to finish the William Street project, rebuild Upper Street, replace a culvert on Apple Valley Road, and arm wrestled the State to keep the huge TIP project of Conway Street, South Street and Conway Road on track (no mean feat). She was also successful in winning grants for Nilman Road culvert/bridge replacement, Lower Ashfield Street – which, importantly, will include improvements in water service - and partial improvement of Charlemont Road which includes the engineering and temporary repair of a key culvert that is collapsing. We will see much of these grants come to fruition in this calendar year.

I urge you to read the reports of the various Town committees all of whom were able to accomplish an amazing amount of work even through this epidemic. And an especially heartfelt thank you to the Board of Health who worked tirelessly on our behalf throughout the year.

And as I write this I am close to finishing another quarter of my life: my first 25 years was spent growing and learning, the next 25 years was spent earning, and these past 25 years (or nearly) was spent serving the Town of Buckland. Thank you for giving me the joy (and sometimes frustration) of serving this most wonderful of Towns. I gained more than I gave.

BUCKLAND BOARD OF HEALTH ANNUAL REPORT 2020

2020 was a challenging and difficult year for the Board of Health and for all the Town government. Our County health agents, Randy and Lisa, assumed more of the Boards jobs to help with the overload that Covid 19 has brought to all of us.

Another heating season with more problems with air quality, but some improvement has occurred with somewhat less wood burning, and better guidance and controls in place. The Board undertakes educational pamphlets and announcements about proper wood use and coordinates with the Fire Chief for enforcement of State laws and guidelines.

Much work has been done on the vacant and abandoned housing front, and we have received much help and guidance from the FRCOG and the state to align these efforts with local and state laws and programs. Some properties have already had work done to bring them into compliance with the building and health codes so they may return to use.

The Covid 19 epidemic was challenging on many fronts and response evolved as the months wore on, with weekly meetings of the Buckland Covid Task Force. Mask wearing and distancing was complied with by most Buckland residents. FRCOG and its public health division procured flu and Covid vaccines and organized clinics to administer them, including at Mohawk Trail High School. FRCOG's health workers have also mostly handled the response to positive tests for Covid 19 and done contact tracing.

On a positive note either from wide masking and/or flu vaccinations, there have been very few respiratory illnesses other than Covid 19 this past fall season. Franklin County has generally done better than the rest of the state, and better than most of the country with Covid 19 cases and deaths.

Other public health issues have continued to be addressed by the board and representatives from FRCOG. These have included continuing food inspections, septic inspections, housing issues, animal bites, distancing and masking problems in town and at the towns transfer station.

Decisions at the local level were guided by information presented at biweekly state webinars with updates on Covid rules and recommendations, Covid case numbers, and the vaccine rollout. Marti Ferguson of the BOH represented the town at most of the task force meetings, webinars, FRCOG meetings, and other state and county agencies.

In 2020 there were ten food establishment permits issued and no permits for recreational camps as they were all closed.

During the year of 2019, the towns of Buckland, Colrain, Gill, Heath, Monroe, Northfield, and Shelburne join in partnership with the Franklin County Sheriff's Office to create the Franklin County Regional Animal Control program and hire a Regional Animal Control Officer.

The year of 2020, was the first full year that this program was in operation. While the Coronavirus pandemic has made this past year has been very unusual, Franklin County Regional Animal Control logged 563 calls for service between January 1st and December 31st 2020. In 2019, Franklin County Regional Animal Control logged 188 calls in the four months the program was in operation (August-December).

BUCKLAND ANIMAL INSPECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2020

Like so many other things this past year, the annual barn inspection and animal census was cancelled, by the Director of MDAR's Division of Animal Health, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and its ensuing health and safety concerns. Normal completion of the inspection and census is set to resume during the fall of 2021, and it will be interesting to see if anecdotal reports of a resurgence of homesteading practices, including livestock husbandry, will be borne out in the numbers of animals enumerated during the coming fall. I have certainly missed making the rounds of our town's farms and barnyards and will look forward to once again connecting with Buckland livestock stewards and their charges.

In other Animal Inspector business, it was a relatively busy year for reports of domestic animals encountering wildlife, and for bite reports. During the course of 2020, six (6) domestic animals (dogs and cats) were placed in 45 day quarantine after having either contact with suspect wildlife or a wound of unknown origin, and five (5) domestic animals were placed in 10 day quarantines for biting humans or other domestic animals. All quarantined animals were released at term with no indication of disease.

Additionally, three (3) wild animals from Buckland were submitted for rabies testing to the State Public Health Laboratory – one raccoon, one bat, and one skunk. Of these, the raccoon did test positive. While rabies is not an uncommon disease in Massachusetts (more than 5,000 cases were reported between 1992 and 2018), most cases occur in wild animals like raccoons, skunks, bats and sometimes woodchucks and foxes. Fortunately, encounters with humans or their pets is rare. Remember, stay away from wild animals, report encounters to your veterinarian, the local Animal Inspector, or the Board of Health, and make sure to keep you pets up to date on their vaccinations!
