WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT COVID-19 IN YOUR TOWN.

Buckland continues to see positive cases but to date our rate of cases keeps us in the grey zone of the community-by-community map. This rate is 100 percent driven by you. The more you wear your face covering, social distance and wash your hands the healthier our Town will be. Thank you for doing your part and keeping our community color-free.

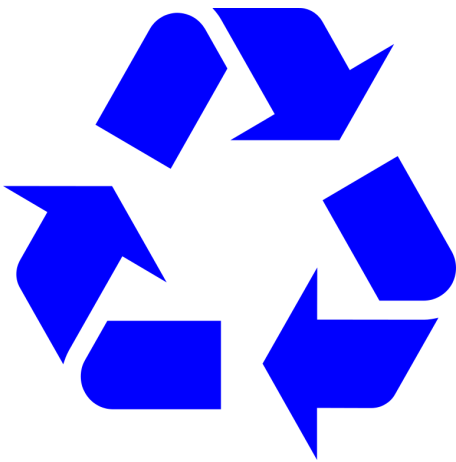

Big News!

Pizza boxes can be recycled after all!

2020 update: A recent study by West Rock (a major US corrugated cardboard recycler) found that, contrary to what we've always been told, grease in pizza boxes does NOT cause problems for recycled paper manufacturers (strength) and printers (ink wouldn't stick). So, it is OK to put the ENTIRE pizza box into paper recycling...as long as it is empty (no crusts, food, foil, plastic or waxed paper, please!) The WestRock study concluded that "...there is no significant technical reason to prohibit post-consumer pizza boxes from the recycle stream"

NOTES & VOTES

- Met (via Zoom) the new Director of Senior Services at the Shelburne Falls Senior Center. Welcome Amanda Joao.
- Heard an overview of next fiscal year's solid waste budget from Jan Ameen, Director of the Franklin County Solid Waste Management District.
- Renewed Liquor Licenses for 2021.
- Accepted a proposal from Weston & Sampson for design services for Charlemont Road reconstruction and culvert repair.
- Extended the contracts for the FY18 and FY19 CDBG contracts allowing more money to be contributed to the Franklin County food bank and adding one additional Wayfinding sign to the Village.
- Signed a letter of support for Red Gate Farm's grant application to building a winter dormitory.
- Accepted with regrets a resignation from James Sullivan from the Conservation Commission and appointed Steve Howland as a new member.
- Approved modifications to the Town's CARES Act expenditures for MTRSD and the police station.
